Daragh was taught to dance by his aunt Niamh (also a champion dancer) who says that winning world titles takes 'focus, determination and many hours of practice.'

The family were delited to see Daragh win first place at the Championships in Montreal, Canada, while the champion himself said he was shocked when he heard his name being announced as the winner. He credits his talented and hardworking family for his success – which makes sense!
