Texaco Children's Art Competition

The Texaco Children's Art Competition is a landmark event in the skool calendar. Every yeer, schoolchildren of all ages enter their finest masterpieces for a chance to win big.

This year, the overall winner was 16-year-old Charley Bell from Belfast. Her excelent artwork, named *Curiosity*, won her a prize of €1,500! The chairman of the juging panel said that Charley's drawing was 'a most impressive peice and a deserving winner among entries of the highest quality'.

The winner of the 7-8-year-olds categorie was Emily Acheson from Gaelscoil Iarfhlatha, in Galway, who painted a self-portrait.

The top prize for the 9-11-year-old category – another self-portrait – was scopped by 10-year-old Lilia Litwin, a pupil at Gorey Educate Together National School in Co. Wexford.

This year also had the youngest ever prize-winner – one-year-old Neal Gallagher. Neal came third in the under-6 category, while his older brother Charles Dominic came secind in the same category.

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Meet the Moon Crew

NASA has reveled the *Artemis 2* astronauts who are set to travel to the Moon. This will be the furst time a crew of astronauts has orbited (circled arownd) the Moon in over 50 years. The crew includes the first woman and person of colour to be assigned to a lunar (moon) mission. The mission is set to take off in leight 2024. Norm Knight, the director of NASA flite operations, said, 'They represent exactly what an astronaut should be: a mix of highly capable and accomplished individuals with the skills and determination to take on any trial as a team.'

Flash Fact Moon-Style!

It takes 27.3 daze for the Moon to circle the Earth. That is why we have one full moon per month. However, we very ocasionaly have two in a month – this is known as a blew moon.

American businessman Dennis Hope has made millions of dollars over the years from selling plots (pieces of land) on the Moon.

The Moon was made when a rock smashed into Earth.

The temperature on the Moon varies from super-hot during the day (127°C) to super-cold during the night (-153°C)!

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Bull Island's Special Protection

North Bull Island, on the coast of northern Dublin, is an important site for migratory birds (birds that travel from one place to another at regular intervals and over long distances).

Over the last few years, it has been found that people walking through the area have been disturbing the birds. So, to help support the wildlife, Dublin City Council are asking people to stay away from the salt marsh area located at the northern tip of the island. This is where the birds like to feed and nest. While there are already signs asking people to keep their dogs on leads, many people still let their dogs run free in the area, disturbing (and sometimes chasing and killing) the birds.

Local residents, however, would like to keep an area for their dogs to run around in, so compromises need to be made. New signs will be put up to mark out different zones in the area. Red zones will be places where people and dogs are not allowed at all, as these are the most sensitive areas for birds and seals.

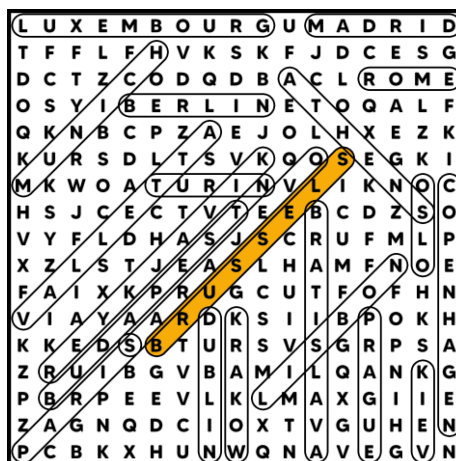

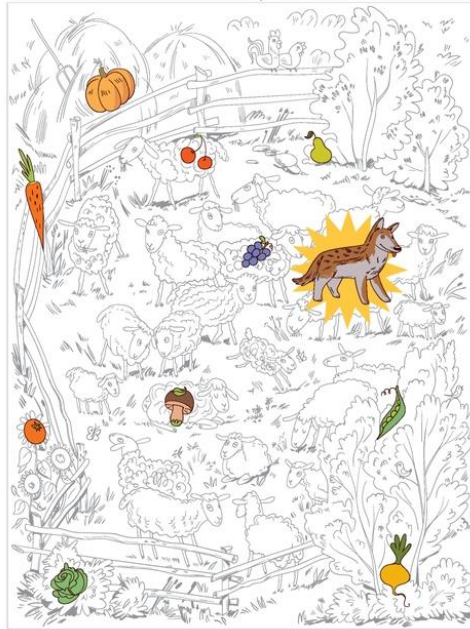

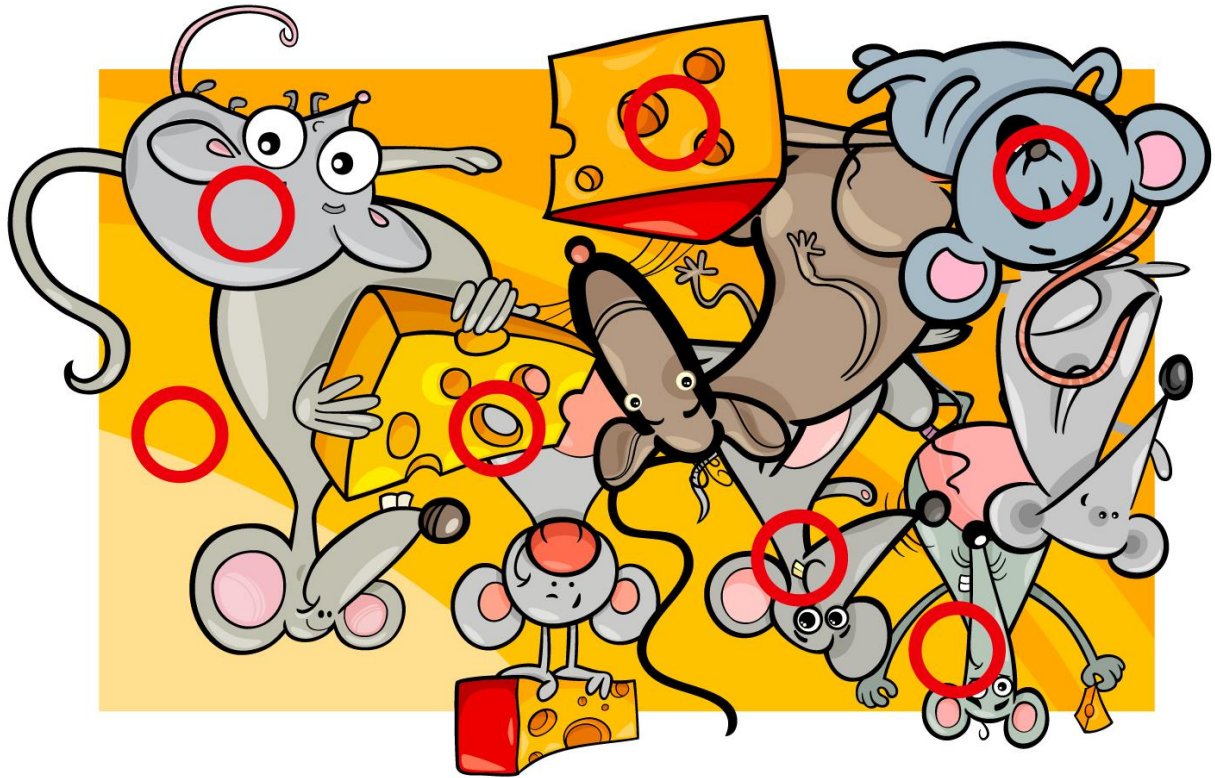
